

**The ET&WNC RR Historical Society will hold its 28<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention in Johnson City in June.**

The ET&WNC Railroad, known by most as the “Tweetsie” originated in Johnson City, Tennessee and ran on its narrow gauge, 3 foot tracks, all the way to Cranberry, North Carolina bringing iron ore and timber to Johnson City and lots of freight to North Carolina as well as moving passengers on its coaches. The railroad made its last run in October 1950 but the ET&WNC RR Historical Society keeps its memory and its history alive. On June 3, 4 and 5<sup>th</sup> the Society will hold its annual convention for the second time in Johnson City co-hosted by ETSU’s George L. Carter Railroad Museum.
